## Letter From Mayor Cumberledge

Hello Citizens,

The hot topic around town most of the year has been how the presence of the casino will help our town. So, after some studies were done and friendly conversations between the Ponca Tribe and the City of Carter Lake, there is some exciting news. We have approved an amendment with the Ponca Tribe of Nebraska on the new interim casino! Not only does this bring new jobs and opportunity to Carter Lake, it also brings financial support to help make our community better. They have made a commitment to our town that they will contribute \$2,325,000 over a 3 year period. The first year starts with \$250,000 thirty days before opening, \$400,000 ninety days after opening and \$125,000 during the first year. The same schedule follows for the next 2 years. At that point they should be ready with the full build-out then a new agreement will be negotiated. This has been a long thought out process on both sides and I believe it will be very beneficial for everyone involved.

I was asked by a long time resident why we only give tax breaks to new businesses or residents to get them to build in our town. I explained to him that everyone has this option, not only new people in the residential areas. Any new construction or major improvement has the option to apply for a 3 year tax abatement. You pay no taxes on the improvements for 3 years. In the commercial area in certain districts, we use Tax Increment Financing where a percentage of the project can be rebated back to the developer over 10 years. They pay property taxes from day one, then the property taxes are rebated back to them.

Another topic that has been a concern to many for a few years is the lakeshore along the club sidewalk. I have visited with the Iowa DNR about this and they have committed \$40,000 for materials for this project. The City Council approved a contract last meeting to armor 1,490 feet of the shoreline with 1,120 tons of class E rip rap to stop the erosion from occurring. This class E rock is a harder rock than was used before and should last longer. The work will be done this fall and winter by city employees.

This year, the City Council and I have asked the Police Department to do more community programs which is a big part of what makes a community grow and helps build awareness on crime and drug prevention. On August 7<sup>th</sup> at Mabrey Park from 6:00 to 9:00 pm, the Police, Fire and Rescue will be hosting a "National Night Out". Hope to see you there!

With the river being high the last month, there were some challenges with the sewer and pumping systems. Our Maintenance Department stayed on top of it and no major damage was done. Thanks go out to Stan, Randy and Phillip in our Maintenance Department.

One of the biggest concerns I hear about is speeding around town. Please be considerate of others. Residential streets are 15 mph unless otherwise posted. Any questions or concerns, contact the Police Department at 712-347-5920.

In order to make the clean-up day a success, we need you to follow some basic rules:

1. Items must be on curb Friday

night. Small items should be in a box, trash can or bag.

2. Containers must not weigh more than 50 pounds.
3. All appliances must be empty and the doors removed.
4. All tree limbs and wood must be in bundles that do not exceed 4 feet and 50 pounds.
5. Violators will not have their trash removed.
6. A tire disposal dumpster will be available at the City Maintenance Shop. Please place tires inside dumpster.

### ***Animal Control***

Summer is in full swing and with the weather getting warmer, our pets are going to be spending more time outside. Here are a few things you need to know to keep them safe:

1. Anytime you have animals outside unattended, you need to provide a few things for them. Clean water and an approved shelter must be provided at all times. This is a requirement of the city ordinances regardless of how long the animal is outside.
2. Your animal can only be outside for 30 minutes if it is on a leash or chain. The only exception to this is if an adult over the age of 19 is outside with the animal or you have a fully fenced yard.

Additionally, if you do have an animal on a tie-out, you must make certain that it cannot reach public sidewalks or your neighbor's yard.

3. Remember to pick up your pet waste. Not only is this a health hazard to your animal but can also be a nuisance to your neighbors. The warmer weather will cause excess pet waste to smell very badly. The first offense could result in a \$500.00 fine.

4. Barking dogs are a common complaint. It is your responsibility as a dog owner to control your dog's actions especially barking. Barking dogs can be heard for blocks away and usually sets off a chain reaction of other dogs barking.



5. It is unlawful to leave an animal unattended in a vehicle. Temperatures inside vehicles can easily reach over 100 degrees. This can cause serious health problems and even result in death. Even with the windows cracked and a bowl of water in the vehicle, the temperatures can still be too much for your animal to handle.

#### **GUIDE TO PAVEMENTS:**

##### Grass Pave

This "green" pavement captures rain. A gravel bed is covered by a heavy plastic frame covered by soil and planted to grass. Use in low traffic areas. Installation only by a trained contractor.

##### Modular Pavers

Permeable pavers capture rain. Use them in your driveway or at the apron of your driveway. The pavers are underlain by a rock chamber. Installation only by a trained contractor.

##### Porous Asphalt

Porous asphalt captures rain. Try it in your driveway or at the apron of your driveway. It has pore spaces to capture the runoff and is underlain by a rock chamber. Installation only by a trained contractor.

##### Pervious Concrete

Pervious concrete captures rain. Try it in your driveway or at the apron of your driveway. It has pore spaces to capture the runoff and is underlain by a rock chamber. Installation only by a trained contractor.

### **GOLF CARTS ON CITY STREETS**

Iowa Code 321.247

Incorporated areas may, upon approval of their governing body,

allow the operation of golf carts on city streets by persons possessing a valid driver's license.

However, a golf cart shall not be operated upon a city street which is a primary road extension through the city but shall be allowed to cross a city street which is a primary road extension through the city.

The golf carts shall be equipped with a slow moving vehicle sign and a bicycle safety flag and operate on the streets only from sunrise to sunset.

Golf carts operated on city streets shall be equipped with adequate brakes and shall meet any other safety requirements imposed by the governing body.

Golf carts are not subject to the registration provisions of this chapter.

### **“Move Over Law” Expanded to All Vehicles**

Drivers traveling on Iowa's roads will have to pay more attention to cars and other vehicles parked on the side of the road, or risk being fined.

Starting July 1, all drivers must move over or at least slow down for all vehicles with flashing emergency lights. This past session saw the state's "Move Over" expanded to include a stationary construction vehicle and allows a stationary construction vehicle to display flashing amber lights. The law also now extends to any stationary motor vehicle that is

continuously displays its emergency signal lamps flashing simultaneously.

The previous law only required a driver approaching an authorized emergency vehicle, utility vehicle, municipal maintenance vehicle, towing or recovery vehicle, highway maintenance vehicle, stationary solid waste or recycling vehicle, that are displaying flashing yellow to use due caution when approaching or make a lane change if possible.

### **GRASS & WEEDS**

All property owners are responsible to keep their land and the adjacent parking areas free of weeds and grass that are 9" or taller. The City will have any uncontrolled weed growth abated without prior notice to the property owner. The cost of the abatement will be billed to the property owner along with a \$75 administrative fee. Do not mow, blow or sweep your grass clipping onto the street or the curb area! If you have a property in your neighborhood that needs mowed or cleaned up, please call City Hall at 712-347-6320.

### ***Carter Lake to join cities nationwide for "America's National Night Out Against Crime"***





# Middle School Renovation Bond

SPECIAL ELECTION | SEPTEMBER 11, 2018

Council Bluffs Community School District residents will have the opportunity to go the polls on September 11, 2018, to vote on whether the district should issue a General Obligation Bond to fund improvements and renovation at the District’s two middle schools, Kirn and Wilson.

Renovations will address areas of concern identified during a facility audit:

<b>Security &amp; Safety</b>	<b>Building Systems &amp; Energy Efficiency</b>
<b>Accessibility</b>	<b>Learning Environment</b>

## IMPROVE SECURITY AND SAFETY

- ▶ Provide direct visual observation of the main entry point(s), safety vestibule at the main entries, and multiple layers of security within the buildings.
- ▶ Make code-mandated upgrades to restrooms, smoke separation walls, exiting paths, and hardware.

## IMPROVE ACCESSIBILITY

- ▶ Ensure accessibility for all students, staff and visitors to all building areas, including classrooms, restrooms and improved signage.
- ▶ Remove the barrier of steps by relocating the front entrance at Kirn.
- ▶ Improve traffic flow by separating parent and bus drop-off zones.

## IMPROVE BUILDING SYSTEMS AND ENERGY EFFICIENCY

- ▶ Replace/upgrade the **mechanical systems** to provide increased comfort, improved indoor air quality, and higher efficiency.
- ▶ Upgrade **plumbing systems**; replace plumbing fixtures in restrooms – add fixtures where required and improve access to drinking water.
- ▶ Replace/upgrade **electrical systems**; replace obsolete distribution panels and wiring, remove previously abandoned equipment, upgrade for technology and charging stations.
- ▶ Replace and/or upgrade **lighting systems**; LED fixtures, dimmers, for improved lighting quality and control.
- ▶ Replace **windows and doors**, where needed.

## IMPROVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

- ▶ Add natural daylight where possible.
- ▶ Increase the size of some classrooms and re-configure learning spaces.
- ▶ Transform auditorium/lecture halls into flexible learning spaces.
- ▶ Update interior finishes, including carpet, cabinets, some furnishings.

## MIDDLE SCHOOL RENOVATION BOND SPECIAL ELECTION | SEPTEMBER 11, 2018

**A committee of district teachers, parents and administrators completed a year-long study of the school buildings from an educational, safety, and efficiency perspective. Middle school building specifications were developed, and preliminary plans were drafted to update the two schools.**

The school district's 11 elementary schools and two high schools have already been renovated to meet standards, using the revenue from the existing one-cent sales tax for schools. This sales tax is in effect until 2029, and the district has borrowed ahead on the future revenues to complete the projects at the other schools over the past two decades.

**\$37 million = less than 10¢ a day average per household.**

The 20-year general obligation bond would add about \$31 to the property tax annually on the average-priced home in Council Bluffs.

The \$37 million bond would fund the renovation at the schools and the purchase and renovation of the former Target building at the Mall of the Bluffs to be used as the relocation site for each school. Kim students would attend school at the alternate site for the 2019-2020 school year, and Wilson students would attend school at the relocation site for the 2020-2021 school year. The use of an alternate site shortens the renovation schedule, rather than stretching it over multiple years while students are occupying school buildings. It also provides for a more stable and safer learning environment, free of construction noise and debris that would distract learning. The cost to utilize an alternate site is more cost effective than extending the construction out over several years at each building. The space at the Mall of the Bluffs could then be re-purposed for district programming.

*"In my first year as superintendent of schools, I have witnessed the significant pride our students, staff and parents have in our beautifully updated elementary and high school facilities," Superintendent Dr. Vickie Murillo said. "Asking our community to consider a general obligation bond to renovate our middle schools is the natural next step to ensuring our students are being educated in learning environments that are safe, accessible and efficient, and that provide the appropriate setting to enhance the engaging classroom experiences we are providing for our students."*






