Letter from Mayor Cumberledge

Hello Citizens:

With winter behind us, it is now time for outdoor activities. Let's all be good neighbors and do our part. If you see something that needs attention, please call our Building Inspector, Lem or our Police Chief, Shawn. They will be handling our abatement process and I will meet with them weekly to help move this along.

The lake recharge pump has been on and running since early March. I had a concerned citizen tell me that the airport was dewatering, so I reached out to the Airport Authority and they said they are not. So, with the pump going and the April showers to come, the lake should be usable in no time. I have also set a meeting with the DNR to try and find funding for the Club Area shoreline. I hope to have more info next month.

We have filled the position in the Clerk's office. I believe Gina Smith will be a great asset to this office. She is at the front desk and answers the phones and is always pleasant to talk to.

I had a phone call from a realtor in Omaha and he said there isn't much of an inventory of homes for sale in Carter Lake. It might be a 20 year low for the area. That shows

good things are happening in Carter Lake...nobody wants to leave.

My goal is to have Carter Lake be a more business and family friendly city. In the first few months of being in office, I have worked hard to address the issues of public safety and fiscal responsibility. The Council and I have made a commitment to improving our Police Department training and day-to-day operations. We will be adding a new officer in July, making our department a ten man department. I have been working with all of our departments to see more community programs. The Senior Center and the Library have partnered to bring more adult activities to our community. Chris with the Parks Department has soccer, baseball, movie night and the Fishing Derby which is scheduled for Saturday, June 2nd from 9:00 am to Noon. The following Saturday, June 9th is Carter Lake Community Day. We have some new things going on this year, so make sure you come and check it out. We look forward to seeing you all there.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Trees, shrubbery, carpet, fencing, poles, iron, etc. must be cut in 4' lengths, bundled, and cannot weigh more than 50 pounds per bundle; Garden waste;
- White Goods (Appliances) MUST be empty and door removed; water heater, stove dehumidifier, freezer, air conditioner, TV.
- **ALL TIRES** - Take to DUMPSTER located at City Maintenance Shop Saturday ONLY

MATERIALS THAT WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED

- **Construction and demolition material** (bricks, stones, concrete, concrete block or rubble, shingles, lumber, landscape timbers, siding, and drywall).
- **Liquids** (motor oil, antifreeze, paint, and household chemicals). Some service stations accept motor oil for recycling. Empty paint cans will be accepted if the drivers can see that the paint is dried or absorbed with a substance like cat litter or saw dust.
- **Hazardous materials** (flammables, propane tanks, auto parts, explosives). Auto parts should be taken to an auto salvage yard. Propane Tanks and Hazardous Materials may be dropped off to the Recycling Center, 4441 Gifford Road, Council Bluffs (712) 328-4985
- **E-Waste (electronics)**. The Recycling Center, 4441 Gifford Road, Council Bluffs, (712)328-4985. Drop off VCR's, DVD players, stereo equipment, clock radios, gaming equipment, computer towers, mice and keyboards, input devices, scanners, video and surveillance cameras, fax machines and cordless phones for recycling (Cost 25 cents/lb).



Ordinance Summary: Potentially Dangerous Breeds

A potentially dangerous breed shall include the following: A pit bull, which is defined as any dog that is an American pit bull terrier, a Staffordshire terrier, or American Staffordshire terrier, and any dog of mixed breeding that has the primary characteristics of an American pit bull terrier, a Staffordshire terrier, or an American Staffordshire terrier. The American Kennel Club and United Kennel Club standards for the above breeds shall be on file for viewing at the city's animal shelter.

Within **(10)** days after acquiring a potentially dangerous breed, or after moving to the city limits owner must register the dog with Animal Control. And on an annual basis, obtain a potentially dangerous breed permit and a window sticker. As a condition of registration, the owner shall provide sufficient evidence that they are in compliance with the following:

Permit. A potentially dangerous breed may be kept within the city limits only so long as the registered owner complies with the requirements of the potentially dangerous breed permit.

Permit fee. Annual fee of \$150.00

Rabies vaccination. Owner must provide proof of annual rabies vaccination.

Current city license. The owner must purchase an annual city license for the dog, and the dog must wear the city license tag on its collar at all times.

Microchip. The dog must be identified by means of a microchip that is injected under its skin by a licensed veterinarian and maintained.

Photo. Owner must bring dog to City Hall to have its photo taken with the owner.

Sterilized. The owner must provide documentary proof from a licensed veterinarian that their dog has been spayed or neutered. This requirement shall not apply if: (see code for full explanation)

PERMIT CONDITIONS.

Place of confinement. A potentially

dangerous breed must reside at the owner's residence or place of business. Any property wherein a dangerous animal is kept, harbored or confined shall be posted with warning signs visible from all areas of public access.

The warning signs must be no less than 10 inches by 12 inches, contain the words "Warning; Potentially Dangerous Animal", in high contrast lettering on a black background in English, and lettering must be no less than three inches high.

Confinement. A potentially dangerous dog shall be confined indoors or by a fence that is of adequate height and construction to prevent the dog's escape. Potentially dangerous dogs shall not be confined with an electronic containment device, or invisible fence.

Leash, harness and muzzle. Any person owning, harboring or having the care of a potentially dangerous animal shall not permit such dog to go beyond the property unless the dog is under the control of a person 19 years of age or older and restrained securely by a harness and leash no longer than six feet and properly muzzled to reasonably prevent the animal from biting.

Liability Insurance. Owner must provide evidence of a current and effective minimum \$100,000.00 public liability insurance policy to be maintained for the period of such designation or throughout the life of the potentially dangerous breed.

No transfer of permit. A potentially dangerous breed permit shall not transfer to a new owner residing in the city limits. The new owner must meet all registration requirements within ten (10) days of acquiring the dog.

Relocation reported. The owner of a potentially dangerous breed may relocate the dog to owner's new Carter Lake residence or business. Notify the Animal Control Officer of new address and obtain a new window sticker. The new window sticker must be posted within thirty (30) days of the move.

Maximum number. The number of dogs kept at one residence shall not exceed two .

Dangerous breed regulation violations. Failure to comply with any potentially dangerous breed registration requirement or permit condition within the allotted ten (10) day time period shall constitute a violation of this chapter and may result in the issuance of a citation and a warrant to seize the owner's dog.

Noncruelty violations. Permits to keep a potentially dangerous breed may be revoked by Animal Control upon the owner's second conviction for violation of the city's noncruelty animal code provisions. If the permit(s) is revoked, a warrant to seize the potentially dangerous breed may be served on the owner if the dog is not removed from the city limits. In addition, the owner shall lose their right to register any potentially dangerous breed within the city for a period of two (2) years.

Cruelty violations. Upon conviction for any animal cruelty charge, the owner of a potentially dangerous breed shall lose their potentially dangerous breed permit(s) and shall lose their right to register any potentially dangerous breed within the city for a period of ten (10) years. A warrant may be obtained to seize the owner's potentially dangerous breed dog(s) pending adjudication of the cruelty violation citation. Upon conviction for animal cruelty and revocation of the potentially dangerous breed permit, the owner's potentially dangerous breed dog(s) must be removed from the city limits or surrendered to the Nebraska Humane Society in Omaha, NE.

Authority to Euthanize

If a potentially dangerous breed is declared to be a vicious animal pursuant to the provisions of subsection 85.10 the dog shall be euthanized within 72 hours of the final vicious dog declaration.

Representative Charles McConkey Legislative Update

We're in the home stretch here at the Iowa House, and we've been debating long hours so we can finish up mid-April.

My colleagues and I have been busy getting to work passing several pieces of bipartisan legislation this past month. First, a bill prohibiting lunch shaming in schools would keep students who owe a lunch debt from being singled out and humiliated. No child should have to go hungry, or face consequences that only hinder their performance at school. The House also passed a measure requiring educators to take a suicide prevention training course, a bill that could have a major effect on preventing future tragedies. Though there is still much room for improvement in training our educators, the suicide prevention bill is a promising first start. Other legislation passed by the house this month include a bill to approve American Sign Language as a language course in high schools, expansion of the Safe Haven Law, and a consumer protection bill on

scanning devices that steal credit card information. Several of these bills have already made their way to the Governor's desk, and I am hopeful that the rest will be signed into law soon.

The House has also been focused on addressing the opioid crisis. Early in the month we voted on a bill that expands who is required to use the Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP), and includes Good Samaritan language that provides certain protections to those who seek treatment for a drug-related overdose. This bipartisan measure takes a step in the right direction of monitoring and addressing the opioid addiction plaguing our state, and it now awaits a vote in the Senate.

As we finish up the session this next month, I am looking forward to summer back in Carter Lake & Council Bluffs. Though the legislature won't be in session, I still always welcome any input from my constituents. Whether it is an idea for legislation, a concern in your community, or just input on how I'm

doing, I am here to listen.

Permits & Pets

Projects Requiring Permits

- ◆ New structures, additions, renovations, pools and fences
- ◆ Submit Application to Building Inspector
- ◆ Applications available at City Hall or online at www.cityofcarterlake.com

Sidewalk & Driveway Permits

- ◆ Required to replace existing or install new sidewalk & driveway.
- ◆ Site will be reviewed by Building Inspector to insure the project meets code requirements.

Electrical, Mechanical & Plumbing

- ◆ All contractors must complete an Application and have necessary Permits issued by the Building Inspector before starting any work.

Pets

- ◆ All registration due in January
- ◆ Late Fee of \$5 is assessed after March 1st.
- ◆ Dogs and cats are required to be on a leash or under control at all times
- ◆ When walking pets owners are responsible for the proper disposal of waste.
- ◆ Allowing any animal to bark, whine, or howl for a prolonged period of time is prohibited and a ticket could be issued.
- ◆ If your pet bites a person or another pet in an unprovoked attack, the pet is subject to quarantine, could be deemed vicious, requiring the pet license be revoked and the animal to be removed from city limits.

Property Maintenance

Lawn Care

- ◆ To ensure quality air, the burning of garbage, leaves, and yard waste is prohibited.
- ◆ Mowing grass into the street is prohibited, grass gets into the storm sewer and causes expensive sewer backups.
- ◆ Yard waste (Grass clippings, garden, brush and trees) shall be disposed with garbage pickup.
- ◆ Yards that contain noxious weeds or provide habitat for snakes, rodents or vermin must be mowed or sprayed.
- ◆ If you have concerns about weeds and tall grass in your area which may be considered a nuisance contact Building Inspector 847-0535.

Trees

- ◆ Property owner is responsible for all trees, shrubs and weeds being properly trimmed away from sidewalks and fences to allow pedestrians to safely use sidewalks.
- ◆ The City is responsible for removing damaged or hazardous trees or shrubs within the City right-of-way. This may include items that obstruct the view of traffic.
- ◆ Trees located on private property are the responsibility of the property owner.
- ◆ If you have concerns about trees contact City Maintenance (712) 847-0570

Fire Works

If it leaves the ground or explodes, it's illegal. That means no firecrackers, torpedoes, skyrockets, roman candles or any other explosives "prepared to produce a visible or audible effect.

Also, keep in mind that although you can possess fireworks in Iowa, it is unlawful to sell or shoot them off. Sparklers, snakes or caps used in cap pistols are legal.

Sidewalks

- ◆ To keep pedestrians and bicyclists safe, snow and ice must be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours of the cessation of the accumulation. Failure to clear will result in city clearing snow and billing at \$___ / Per hour to property owner,
- ◆ Property owners are responsible for the side-walks and area from the curb to the property line. Sidewalks that become unsafe are the responsibility of the property owner to repair or replace.
- ◆ To Report a sidewalk that is damaged or has not had the snow removed, contact Building Inspector 347-6320.

General Care

- ◆ Vehicles classified as junk vehicles may not be stored within the city limits for more than 48 hours unless the vehicle is stored in a garage.
- ◆ The outdoor storage or placement of household appliances, and furnishings unless designed for the outdoors is prohibited and considered a public nuisance.

Snow Parking Emergency

- ◆ It shall be conclusively presumed that any snowfall of 4 inches or more, creates a snow emergency.
- ◆ When an unauthorized vehicle is found on a public street during a snow emergency the police officer will issue a \$35 and towing charge has authority to have the vehicle towed at the owners expense.
- ◆ On street parking may resume when the street or alley has been cleared of the snow.

Recreational Fire Pit

Are allowed for the purpose of open fires for cooking, heating, recreation and ceremonies, provided they comply with the State Dept of Natural Resources laws. Rubber tires shall not be burned in a recreational fire.




