Letter from Mayor Waltrip . . .

To the Citizens of Carter Lake:

Once again, it is time for an update. It seems like the 4th of July was just last week. Last month, I highlighted the Park's Department under Director, Chris Ethen. This month I will highlight the Maintenance Department under Director Ron Rothmeyer, 28 years of service; Stanley Olsen, 10 years; Randy Smith, 6 years; and Damian Rothmeyer, 6 years.

The department has had its hands full this pass year; to touch on a few unusual projects; they rebuilt the inside of the concession stand located at ball field #2. They worked on installing 10 new fire hydrants, and rebuilt sewer lift stations in different area's of the city.

Carter Lake never had an integrated sanitary lift station until the city installed one in the Sandy Point area, even though there are homes in the area that have been there for 80 years and our sanitary sewer system, was laid in the late 40's early 50's. In the last 25 years there have been new integrated lift stations all of which puts more of a work load on the Maintenance Dept.

The Dept is completing replacement of the lift at 9th and Steel St. across from the Fire Station. It is critical when we rebuild or replace these stations that we plan for the long term, which we have done at this site.

Also, the Maintenance Department works with the Parks Department to accomplish major repair work in parks and park grounds around the city.

Now to move onto other areas. The Police Department has added a new K-9 officer named Delta, he is a 4 year old German Shepherd. His handler is Officer Owens. Delta will be a true asset to the department and Carter Lake.

I have received a number of calls

concerning the utility work at the corner of 13th and Locust. This is a major upgrade dealing to the natural gas supply line. Carter Lake is served by Black Hills Energy who receives gas from supplier Northern Natural Gas. Because Northern Natural owns the main there are rules that need to be followed. It has taken longer than most projects, but this project has to be dealt with on two different ends; which complicates the time factor. It is all being done in the name of progress.


Now, let me visit with you, the citizens of Carter Lake about our parks. Wavecrest is not very big, but it is a nice quaint park that has a wide view of the lake. But, we are having a hard time staying ahead of the vandalism. The Park and Maintenance Dept have spent many hours over the past 30-45 days cleaning or repairing the damage. It has gotten so bad that this office has no other tools left except to close the park for maintenance purposes. So if the neighborhood of residents observes any problems, please call my office at City Hall or the Police Department. It could help us get things under control as oppose to closing the park.

What I have been doing in the last month's letter is highlighting the parks department and this month highlighting the maintenance department, to let you, the citizens who pay property, gasoline and a myriad of other taxes and fees; know how your tax money is being spent. All of the city employees and numerous volunteers are to be commended for the time they put in. The next letter I will highlight another department, so until next month, as always it is an honor and a privilege to serve as your mayor.

INSPECTIONS, PERMITS & NUISANCES

Carter Lake City Council recently hired Lem Sheard to serve as the residential building inspector.

The inspector has numerous responsibilities which include, nuisance abatements, issuing permits and inspecting the work after permits have been issued.

Brief list of projects requiring permits and inspections.

List of projects requiring permits for RESIDENTIAL and COMMERCIAL

- Dirt Hauling Permit & Deposit Temporary Structures
- Place Modular/Mobile Home Bldg Carport
- Pool/Spa Permanent in ground or above ground
- Demolition of Structure
- Fence; Curb grind/cut; Siding
- Window-Door Replacement-New Roofing Replacement
- Paving, Asphalt and concrete installation
- Storage or Garden Shed Deck or Canopy
- Retaining Walls over 3' high
- Stationary Fire Pits/Grills

MECHANICAL PERMITS

- Installation of New or Replacement Solar or Geo Thermal system
- Furnace units
- A/C unit or Heat Pumps
- Heating & Cooling combined
- Ventilation Fan with Duct
- Heaters; Wall, Duct, Space, Radiant Repairs

ELECTRICAL PERMITS

- Installation of new or replacement of all electrical fixtures

PLUMBING PERMITS

- installation of Water, Sewer or natural gas piping, and fixtures, backflow devices, lawn and fire sprinklers

Nuisances include, but are not limited to:

1. unreasonably offensive smells, or other annoyances, becomes injurious and dangerous to the health, comfort or property of individuals or the public.
2. Causing or suffering any offal, filth or noisome substance to be collected or to remain in any place to the prejudice of others.
3. The dense growth of all weeds, vines, brush or other vegetation as to constitute a health, safety or fire hazard.
4. The storage of any junk vehicles, machinery, trailers or parts thereof on private property
5. The storage of solid waste on private property for more than three days in violation
6. All weeds, vines, bushes, volunteer trees less than three inches in diameter, grass and other growths which exceed a height of nine (9) inches and all noxious weeds of any dimension
7. Materials constructed, stored or placed on the public right-of-way for more than 24 hours, which have not been previously approved as landscaping materials or otherwise authorized by the City for said location.
8. All unsafe buildings, structures or appendages
9. Maintenance of any dilapidated building of whatever kind which is unused by the owner or uninhabited because of deterioration or decay, which condition constitutes a fire hazard or subjects adjoining property to danger of damage

by storm soil erosion or rodent or insect infestation or which becomes a place frequented by trespassers and transients seeking a temporary refuge.

10. Maintenance of any partially or otherwise incomplete structures or abandoned property including, but not limited to fences, parking garages, commercial and residential buildings.
11. Maintenance or use of any building or structure which substantially annoys, injures or endangers the comfort, health, repose or safety of the public by reason of vandalism, inadequate maintenance, abandonment or otherwise, including, but not limited to:
 - Vacant, inadequately maintained or boarded-up buildings or structures located within 1,000 feet of a residentially zoned district which do not show evidence of current construction or remodeling activity;
 - Vacant buildings or structures, regardless of proximity to a residentially zoned district, which are not secure and to which entry may be made through opened or unlocked doors, windows or other openings;
 - Vacant buildings or structures which are likely to attract minors and which constitute a danger to the health, safety or well-being of said minors.

Police Department - Report Suspicious Activities

In recent months there have been multiple instances of citizens utilizing social media to report crimes or nuisances in their neighborhoods.

The Police Department is unable to investigate crimes that are not reported to 9-1-1. It is essential to report any and all criminal or suspicious activity by calling 9-1-1.

Reporting a crime – useful information:

- Anyone who is aware that a crime has been committed can

report it. It is not essential for you to have been personally affected by the crime.

- You can report a crime even if you do not know who committed it.
- You can report a crime at any police station, either verbally or in writing.

Procedure for a criminal case

- The police investigate what has happened. At the end of the investigation, the county attorney's office that has jurisdiction over the case decides whether there is enough evidence to bring charges.
- The County Attorney is responsible for bringing the case

to court and conducting the trial. The accused can provide evidence that he or she is not guilty at any time.

- The judge listens to the evidence, arranges for any additional evidence to be taken and issues a verdict at the end of the trial.
- In principle you can contest the decision by filing an appeal, but it is worth consulting a lawyer before doing this.
- Anyone who has reported a crime can ask the authorities whether criminal proceedings or not.

Become active in protecting our City Parks

Our parks provide places where children and families can enjoy being outdoors — riding bikes, going swimming, using the playground equipment, flying kites or having a picnic. Unfortunately, too often they neglected and trashed.

On daily basis Carter Lake Park employees spend many hours maintaining and cleaning the park and all of the facilities, so they can be used and enjoyed by children and families.

All of us, as a community, need to remember that our parks are important, and not just to residents. Our parks, especially those adjacent to the lake, are regularly visited by tourists; they are integral parts of the tourism industry and thus our economy.

When trash piles up, and the equipment and facilities - especially bathrooms - are broken, destroyed and vandalized, they lose their appeal.

That's why we ALL must work to keep our parks, playgrounds and other recreational facilities, clean and well maintained.

When you and your family visit a park, make sure to clean up — properly dispose of all trash.

If you see suspicious or criminal activity taking place in the parks, notify the police department immediately by calling 9-1-1, the quicker the police are notified, the quicker officers can make contact with the vandals



to send a strong message that illegal activities in our parks will not be tolerated.

All volunteer efforts are very much appreciated, and the City thanks those who make efforts to keep our parks clean and welcoming.

Let's all do our part to keep parks clean, maintained!

Over the next few months you will see small changes made to the facilities at Mabrey Park. The City Council voted to set aside funds to make improvements by adding surveillance cameras and updating the inside of the restrooms. But we still need your help, report activity and take pride in our community, stop vandalism!!



Budget Shortfall May Force Special Session

The state fiscal year closed on June 30th with an estimated \$104 million budget shortfall which could result in lawmakers being called back for a special session later this year.

The final number of the shortfall will not be known until the state closes the books on the fiscal year 2017 (FY 17) budget in late September. If the shortfall is more than \$50 million, lawmakers will have to return to Des Moines for a special session to cover the shortfall with money from Iowa's reserve funds. It would be the second time Republican lawmakers and Gov. Reynolds scooped money from the reserve funds to pay the state's bills this year.

With the total budget shortfall reaching \$350 million this year, the looming question is whether the Legislature will be forced to scale back the budget for this year as well (FY 18). The Republicans have the choice of making decisions early on

to change appropriations for things such as tax credits, or waiting until January when it's too late to make changes and the only option is to take money from reserve funds.

Many state agencies are already making cutbacks this year because they received status quo or a decrease in state funding. The result of those budget choices involve some of Iowa's most vulnerable populations; correctional officers are getting hurt on the job because of under-staffed prisons; students paying higher tuition; fewer at-risk kids are attending preschool; and homeowners paying higher property taxes.

Many lawmakers have expressed concern with the GOP budget decisions noting they've chosen not to address the runaway cost of tax credits and tax breaks to out-of-state companies that are the source of the state's budget troubles and have put Iowa into an unsustainable budget cycle..

3,000 Iowans Lose Overtime Pay

3,000 Iowans will no longer be paid overtime due to actions taken by Republican lawmakers last session.

Many of the employees impacted by this change are nurses at state institutions. Nurses are often scheduled for mandatory overtime to ensure that necessary staffing levels are met and patients receive the best care possible. If nurses leave their shifts prior to their replacement, they lose their licenses. It's likely that other workers, such as social workers and corrections officers, will also lose overtime pay.

During the 2017 legislative session, Republican leaders rushed through House File 291 and effectively ended overtime pay for Iowa workers including nurses, correctional officers, and other state employees. As a result of the legislation, workers no longer have an opportunity to negotiate any overtime pay or workplace protections.

Many lawmakers opposed the changes approved last session because they believe law enforcement officers, firefighters, teachers, nurses, and other Iowa workers deserve a voice and fairness in their own workplace.

Preventing Water Pollution is everyone's responsibility

Stormwater runoff is generated when precipitation from rain and snowmelt events flows over land or impervious surfaces and does not percolate into the ground. As the runoff flows over the land or impervious surfaces (paved streets, parking lots, and building rooftops), it accumulates debris, chemicals, sediment or other pollutants that could adversely affect water quality if the runoff is discharged untreated. The primary method to control stormwater discharges is the use of best management practices (BMPs). In addition, most stormwater discharges are considered point sources and require coverage under an NPDES permit. 
