Letter from our Mayor

To the Citizens of Carter Lake,

Here it is again, another month gone by.

The City Council has had their plate full from the first meeting in January of 2016. Three members Frank Corcoran, Pat Paterson and Mary Schomer have never held public office before and I am certain this year was an eye opener for all of them. One issue the City Council got through was having two meetings each month. The first Monday was added as a workshop meeting that started at 5:00 p.m. on the first Monday of the month. The Council wanted to try this hoping that it would allow let them interact with the Department Supervisors in a public meeting setting. Some council members thought it would be beneficial and a good learning tool for the council members. I thought it was uncomfortable and unfair to the Department Supervisors. It was probably uncomfortable for some citizens who might be there. At the December 18th council meeting, a City Councilman motioned to continue with two meetings a month, but the motion died for lack of a second on his motion. So the City Council will return to its former schedule of meeting once a month. These meetings will be the third Monday of each month. The next meeting will be January 16, 2017. City Council will start working on Budget the later part of January through the middle of February.

Children's Librarian and Program Director, Mary Schomer has been ill for several weeks fighting some tough health issues. Please keep Mary and her husband in your prayers. Their store really lights up the grey area on Locust St. Locust St is starting to develop and redevelop with Casey's on the East end of town and Tighten Tool is getting closer to opening their distribution center and there are more bus possibilities on the horizon.

Yes it will snow this year! Please remember that all sidewalks must be cleared of snow and ice within 24-hours after the snow stops. If you do not remove your snow and ice, the City may remove it and charge you the cost plus an administrative fee. Please keep your sidewalks clear of snow and ice.

Pet Licenses and Updated Animal Ordinance

The new pet ordinances require owners of all dogs and cats that are over three (3) months old shall purchase a license from the City Clerk. Licenses cost \$10 each if pet is spayed and \$15.00 if unsprayed and will be good through January 1 of the following year. In order to obtain a license all dogs and cats must have current rabies vaccinations, which do not expire within six (6) months. Beginning March 1 of each year the license fees will be delinquent and a penalty of five dollars (\$5.00) will be added to each unpaid license.

It is illegal to allow any stray dogs or cats to habitually remain or to be lodged or fed within your house, store, yard, or enclosure.

No household shall have at any one time more than a total of three (3) animals whether dogs or cats or any combination thereof.

Please remember that it is against our local laws to allow your dog to damage, soil, defile or defecate on private property other than your own, or on public walks and recreation areas unless you immediately remove and properly dispose of the pet waste. Please be considerate of your neighbors and friends. Clean up after your dog. If you do not, it could cost you - \$750 for the first offense and \$1,000 for the second offense. This applies all around town, not just in the parks.

WATER SHUT OFF PROCEDURES

92.04 SERVICE DISCONTINUED. Water service to delinquent customers shall be discontinued in accordance with the following: *(Code of Iowa, Sec. 384.84)*



1. Notice. The City's designated billing agent shall notify each delinquent customer that service will be discontinued if payment of the combined service account, including late payment charges, is not received by the date specified in the notice of delinquency. Such notice shall be sent by ordinary mail to the customer in whose name the delinquent charges were incurred and shall inform the customer of the nature of the delinquency and afford the customer the opportunity for a hearing prior to the discontinuance.

2. Notice to Landlords. If the customer is a tenant, and if the owner or landlord of the property or premises has made a written request for notice, the notice of delinquency shall also be given to the owner or landlord. If the customer is a tenant and requests a change of name for service under the account, such request shall be sent to the owner or landlord of the property if the owner or landlord has made a written request for notice of any change of name for service under the account to the rental property.

3. Hearing. If a hearing is requested by noon of the day preceding the shut off, the Clerk shall conduct an informal hearing and shall make a determination as to whether the disconnection is justified. If the Clerk finds that disconnection is justified, then such disconnection shall be made, unless payment has been received.

4. Fees. A fee of thirty dollars (\$30.00) shall be charged before service is restored to a delinquent customer. No fee shall be charged for the usual or customary trips in the regular changes in occupancies of property.

Pets

- ◆ All registration due in January
- ◆ Late Fee of \$5 is assessed after March 1st.
- ◆ Dogs and cats are required to be on a leash or under control at all times
- ◆ When walking pets owners are responsible for the proper disposal of waste.
- ◆ Allowing any animal to bark, whine, or howl for a prolonged period of time is prohibited and a ticket could be issued.
- ◆ If your pet bites a person or another pet in an unprovoked attack, the pet is subject to quarantine, could be deemed vicious, requiring the pet license be revoked and the animal to be removed from city limits.

Property Maintenance

Lawn Care

- ◆ To ensure quality air, the burning of garbage, leaves, and yard waste is prohibited.
- ◆ Mowing grass into the street is prohibited, grass gets into the storm sewer and causes expensive sewer backups.
- ◆ Yard waste (Grass clippings, garden, brush and trees) shall be disposed with garbage pickup.
- ◆ Yards that contain noxious weeds or provide habitat for snakes, rodents or vermin must be mowed or sprayed.
- ◆ If you have concerns about weeds and tall grass in your area which may be considered a nuisance contact Building Inspector 847-0535.

Trees

- ◆ Property owner is responsible for all trees, shrubs and weeds being properly trimmed away from sidewalks and fences to allow pedestrians to safely use sidewalks.
- ◆ The City is responsible for removing damaged or hazardous trees or shrubs within the City right-of-way. This may include items that obstruct the view of traffic.
- ◆ Trees located on private property are the responsibility of the property owner.
- ◆ If you have concerns about trees contact City Maintenance (712) 847-0570

Fire Works

If it leaves the ground or explodes, it's illegal. That means no firecrackers, torpedoes, skyrockets, roman candles or any other explosives "prepared to produce a visible or audible effect.

Also, keep in mind that although you can possess fireworks in Iowa, it is unlawful to sell or shoot them off. Sparklers, snakes or caps used in cap pistols are legal.

Sidewalks

- ◆ To keep pedestrians and bicyclists safe, snow and ice must be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours of the cessation of the accumulation. Failure to clear will result in city clearing snow and billing at \$1.00/foot and \$25 Admin fee to property owner.
- ◆ Property owners are responsible for the sidewalks and area from the curb to the property line. Sidewalks that become unsafe are the responsibility of the property owner to repair or replace.
- ◆ To Report a sidewalk that is damaged or has not had the snow removed, contact Building Inspector 347-6320.

General Care

- ◆ Vehicles classified as junk vehicles may not be stored within the city limits for more than 48 hours unless the vehicle is stored in a garage.
- ◆ The outdoor storage or placement of household appliances, and furnishings unless designed for the outdoors is prohibited and considered a public nuisance.

Snow Parking Emergency

- ◆ It shall be conclusively presumed that any snowfall of 4 inches or more, creates a snow emergency.
- ◆ When an unauthorized vehicle is found on a public street during a snow emergency the police officer will issue a \$35 and towing charge has authority to have the vehicle towed at the owners expense.
- ◆ On street parking may resume when the street or alley has been cleared of the snow.

Recreational Fire Pit

Are allowed for the purpose of open fires for cooking, heating, recreation and ceremonies, provided they comply with the State Dept of Natural Resources laws. Rubber tires shall not be burned in a recreational fire.


