As always it is an honor and a privilege to serve as your Mayor.



## *Police Department*

- Recommended Safety Tips
- Obey all local laws regarding the use of fireworks.
- Know your fireworks; read the cautionary labels and performance descriptions before igniting.
- A responsible adult SHOULD supervise all firework activities. Never give fireworks to children.
- Alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Save your alcohol for after the show.
- Wear safety glasses when shooting fireworks.
- Light one firework at a time and then quickly move away.
- Use fireworks OUTDOORS in a clear area; away from buildings and

- vehicles.
- Never relight a “dud” firework. Wait 20 minutes and then soak it in a bucket of water.
- Always have a bucket of water and charged water hose nearby.
- Never carry fireworks in your POCKET or shoot them into METAL or GLASS containers.
- Do not experiment with homemade fireworks.
- Dispose of spent fireworks by wetting them down and place in a metal trash can away from any building or combustible materials until the next day.
- Report illegal explosives, like M-80s and quarter sticks, to the fire or police department.

## *Animal Control*

The weather is getting warmer and our pets are going to be spending more time outside. Here are a few things you need to know to keep them safe

1. Anytime you have animal outside unattended you need to provide a few things for them. Clean water and an approved shelter must be provided at all times. This is a requirement of the city ordinances regardless of how long the animal is outside.
2. Your animal can only be outside for 30 minutes if it is on a leash or chain. The only exception to this is if an adult over the age of 19 is outside with the animal or you have a fully fenced yard. Additionally, if you do have an animal on a tie out you must make certain that it cannot reach public sidewalk or your neighbors yard.
3. Remember to pick up your pet

waste. Not only is this a health hazard to your animal but can also be a nuisance to your neighbors. The warmer weather will cause excess pet waste to smell very badly. The first offense could result in a \$500.00 fine.

4. Barking dogs are a common complaint. It is your responsibility as a dog owner to control your dogs action especially barking. Barking dogs can be heard for blocks and usually set off a chain reaction of other dogs barking.

5. It is unlawful to leave an animal unattended in a vehicle. Temperatures inside vehicles can easily reach over 100 degrees. This can cause serious health problems and even result in death. Even with the windows cracked and a bowl of water the temperatures can still be too much for your animal to handle.

## City of Carter Lake is Accepting Applications

### ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER

Performs routine work relative to the collection, impoundment and care of dogs and other animals in compliance with City ordinances, County and State laws. The Animal Control Officer must be able to work with little supervision and have some written communication skills for issuing citations or warning notices, etc. Must be able to work well with the public and must like working with animals.

**FUNCTIONS OF POSITION:** The Animal Control Officer must patrol the City streets to apprehend any animals at large or observe any other violations related to the Animal Control laws. Investigates and makes reports of animal bite cases and monitors quarantine periods. Cares for animals picked up and transports unclaimed animals to kennels. Will make court appearances as required for the settlement of citations or other

animal infractions. Keeps records of calls, warnings and citations issued. Prepares any necessary reports as needed. Performs other assigned tasks as directed.

**EDUCATION STANDARD:** High School diploma or G.E.D. Must have some knowledge of City ordinances, County and State laws as it pertains to Animal Control. Must have the ability to write citations or other written correspondence as necessary. Must have the ability to maintain records of Animal Control calls and incidents. Must possess a current valid driver's license.

The Animal Control Officer position is hired by the Chief of Police and is evaluated for merit review by the Chief of Police. The Animal Control Officer position is a part time position with a variety of hours/work schedule.

### **IN MEMORY OF FLO WHITE**

Word was received on June 14, 2017 that long time resident and advocate for Carter Lake, Flo White, passed away peacefully in her sleep.



Flo was born to Polish immigrants and was raised in the Chicago area. Flo moved to her home in Carter Lake in 1962 with her husband John. Flo and

John raised two boys, Jim and John "Bob". Flo was preceded in death by her husband, John.

Flo loved her life in and on Carter Lake. She spent many hours boating, paddle boating and swimming in Carter Lake. She always welcomed friends and acquaintances into her home to enjoy life on the lake.

Her love for Carter Lake extended well beyond her lakefront home. Flo began her career at the Carter Lake

Library as a volunteer. She went on to become the Head Librarian. She was instrumental in building the original permanent library that is now located on Willow Dr.

In addition to her work as the Librarian, Flo spent countless hours as a volunteer in and around Carter Lake. She was one of the original members of the Carter Lake Betterment Committee. Flo cherished the time she spent as a volunteer at the Carter Lake Boys and Girls Club. In her later years Flo volunteered as a home Hospice worker and helped those in need as they spent their last hours and days before passing. When someone needed a volunteer they knew they could count on Flo to step up to the plate and share her skills.

Forever an advocate for Carter Lake, Flo wrote a weekly column for the Daily Nonpareil for over forty years. She was always proud to share the accomplishments of Carter Lake residents and organizations.

In 2007 Flo moved to Los Angeles to live in a downtown LA high-rise loft. While in LA Flo made new friends daily. She loved her new life, while still cherishing fond memories of life in Carter Lake. What Flo loved most about LA was that she lived near her son Jim and that he took such wonderful care of her every need. She could frequently be heard saying, "My Jimmy treats me like a queen". And that he did. Jim never missed a day of contacting Flo, either with a visit, telephone call, or a meal out on the town. He was a kind and caring son and never missed an opportunity to include her in his daily life.

Those who knew Flo loved her for her eccentricities, eclectic style and compassionate caring ways. She knew no enemies and was a friend to many.

Rest in Peace dear friend. You will be missed. You were a "crazy wonderful lady".

**GRASS & WEEDS**

All property owners are responsible to keep their land and the adjacent parking areas free of weeds and grass that are 9” or taller. The City will have any uncontrolled weed growth abated without prior notice to the property owner. The cost of the abatement will be billed to the property owner along with a \$75 administrative fee. Do not mow, blow or sweep your grass clipping onto the street or the curb area! 
**U.S.A. TRIATHLON COMPETITION IS BACK IN CARTER LAKE AUGUST 12-13**

Ortiz Park is named after former city council member who helped in incorporating Carter Lake as an Iowa city.


# CARTER LAKE CELEBRATION

### **NEW LAWS TO HIT BOOKS ON JULY 1**

*Des Moines, Iowa –  
State Representative  
Charlie McConkey of  
Council Bluffs today*

*reminded Iowans about several new laws that will take effect on July 1, the start of the state's new fiscal year.*

“Iowans should be aware of several changes we made to Iowa law beginning on July 1 that could impact their lives,” said McConkey. “This year, we worked together to protect victims of stalking and abuse, help Iowans purchase their first home, crack down on texting while driving, and kept repeat drunk drivers off the roads. We also approved several new laws designed to improve the health of Iowans.”

#### **Jobs & Workforce:**

- Promoted and increased opportunities for local small businesses that make and sell Iowa beer, wine and distilled spirits (HF 607)
- Streamlined process to expand 5G cell phone service to more Iowans (SF 431)
- Directed \$5 million of the states workforce housing tax credit to go to small communities (SF 488)
- Expanded the ways Iowans can earn a high school equivalency diploma (HF 473)
- Created a “Iowa First-Time Homebuyer Savings Account Act” to help first time purchasers pay home costs of a qualified home purchase (SF 505)

#### **Public Health**

- Increased awareness and testing for cytomegalovirus, which can

cause long-term health problems, including hearing or vision loss, lack of coordination and seizures (SF 51)

- Allowed terminally ill patients to use experimental treatments at their own cost (SF 404)
- Added four new products to the list of controlled substances to keep these dangerous drugs off the streets/protect our kids (HF 296)
- Safeguarded appropriate treatment for sick and disabled Iowans by allowing a physician to override an insurance company’s step therapy protocol in certain cases (HF 233)
- Supporting Iowa’s Veterans Ensured that National Guard members from other states working in Iowa are given the same benefits as those who are citizens of Iowa (SF 373)
- Protecting Iowans Strengthen enforcement of texting while driving that allows law enforcement to pull over a driver and ticket them if they see the driver texting (SF 234)
- Expanded move over law to protect utility workers along the roadways (HF 314)
- Broadened definition of child abuse to protect drug endangered children (HF 543)
- Required background checks for temporary employees at health care facilities (HF 576)
- Reduced harassment and invasion of privacy by making it illegal to share images of another person in the nude or engaged in a sex act without their consent (HF 526)
- Expanding the criminal offense of “sexual exploitation by a school

employee” to include full-time, part-time and employees, as well as others who have significant contact with students (SF 238)

- Worked with local officials to assist them in improving 911 services (SF 500)
- Expedited processing of untested rape kits statewide (SF 516)
- Formed new mandatory minimums for certain domestic abuse crimes and provides more protections for victims of stalking (HF 263)
- Created a new civil sexual abuse protective order to allow victims of sexual abuse to be protected from their abusers (SF 401)
- Stopped deceitful and damaging adoption practices that harm Iowa’s families by toughening penalties for scamming prospective adoptive parents (SF 433)
- Reduced drunken driving fatalities and other drug and alcohol-related crimes by establishing 24/7 Sobriety program in counties that want to try this accountability-based program (SF 444)


#### **Agriculture & Natural Resources**

Made it safer for Iowa’s hunters by extending the time allowed to tag a deer carcass if it is located in an unsafe area (HF 254)

- Helped prevent the damaging of crops by putting the Palmer Amaranth on the list of noxious weeds (HF 410)
- Allowed farmers to do their own electrical work on farm buildings (SF 357)


