Letter From Mayor Cumberledge

Welcome to our latest newsletter, the seventh of the year. I hope the monthly updates provide you with some useful information and keep you informed with what is going on around our town.

Last month, our Fishing Derby was a big hit. 80 kids went home with a new fishing pole, t-shirt and prizes. The Carter Lake Days parade, festival and fireworks celebration also had a great turnout. Anyone who would like to be involved in the planning of next year's event, please call our Parks Director, Chris Ethen. Volunteers are always needed.

The City Council approved a GIS mapping vendor to install all of our infrastructure information into a digital mapping program. This will help locate valves, lines and stop boxes easier and help us be much more productive in times when we have a problem with utilities.

This month, we added a new police officer to our department, Matt Sewing. He is a certified officer and went to work right away. This saves a lot of time and money for the City. Normally, a new hire goes to the Police Academy. We are doing some different things in the police department by adding a bike patrol. This gives the department a better way to patrol residential areas. We also purchased a new police cruiser in order to have more officers on the street. We put cars in service for a shift and then the car is out of service for a shift, which gives that car a break and should last longer. Just sticking to that promise of more public safety for our community.

Last week, I had a meeting with the CEO of the Iowa West Foundation and it went very well. I believe the City of Carter Lake and the Iowa West Foundation are strong community partners and will continue to work together in the future.

After meeting with Iowa DNR and going out on the water with them to do a lake weed inspection, we found large growth in the 3' to 6' areas. So in the weed management plan, Omaha will provide the applicators, we have the product, and Iowa DNR will manage it. The plan is in the 100 acre power boating zone. Spot spraying in the 3' to 6' areas. This should be done before the holiday and with no restrictions on the lake.

There are so many volunteers in our town that help us operate every day from the board members to the coaches and fire department. I just want to thank all of them for what they do.

The City Council and I look forward to continuing to improve our community in the most efficient and cost effective manner. Have a safe and happy 4th of July.

Next time you stop in the library, head to the children's section and look up! This beautiful butterfly mobile was made and donated to the library by Julie McKillip and it looks great!





STORMWATER TIPS

Preventing Water Pollution is everyone's responsibility.

IN YOUR YARD

GUIDE TO LANDSCAPING

Plant Trees

Plant trees in your yard. The canopies intercept rain and evaporate water back into the atmosphere.

Native Plants

Use deep rooted native grasses and flowers in your gardens. Minimize the amount of turf in your yard, especially if you have a lot of open area, by using native plants.

Native Turf

Plant your yard with deep rooted native turf grasses. Try using Buffalo and Side Oats Gramma grasses, then mow as a standard lawn with no need to water or fertilize.

Rain Gardens

Create a rain garden to capture downspout water or runoff from your lawn. Dig a depression area in a well drained area where soils will soak up water, not let it puddle. Amend soil before planting, if needed.

Hello from the Senior Center:



Carter Lake to join cities nationwide for "America's National Night Out Against Crime


On Tuesday, August 7th, neighborhoods throughout Carter Lake are being invited to join forces with thousands of communities nationwide for the "35th Annual National Night Out" (NNO) crime and drug prevention event.

National Night Out, which is sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch (NATW) and co-sponsored locally by Carter Lake Police Department, will involve over 16,500 communities from all 50 states, U.S. territories, Canadian cities and military bases around the world. In all, over 38.5 million people are expected to participate in 'America's Night Out Against Crime'.

National Night Out is designed to:

- (1) Heighten crime and drug prevention awareness;
- (2) Generate support for, and participation in, local anticrime efforts;
- (3) Strengthen neighborhood spirit and police community partnerships and
- (4) Send a message to criminals, letting them know neighborhoods are organized and fighting back.

From 7 to 10 p.m. on August 7th, residents in neighborhoods throughout Carter Lake and across the nation, are asked to lock their doors, turn on outside lights and spend the evening outside with neighbors and police. Many neighborhoods throughout Carter Lake will be hosting a variety of special events such as block parties, cookouts, parades, visits from police, flashlight walks, contests, youth activities and



anticrime rallies.

National Project Coordinator Matt Peskin said, "This is a night for America to stand together to promote awareness, safety and neighborhood unity. National Night Out showcases the vital importance of police-community partnerships and citizen involvement in our fight to build a safer nation. On NNO, we invite neighborhoods nationwide to join us in Giving Crime & Drugs A Going Away Party. "

FIREWORKS ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE NO. 656

Fireworks: The use of fireworks within the City limits is prohibited.

Exceptions: The discharging of consumer fireworks (as defined in the newly adopted Section 110.19 of the Code of Iowa) that are permitted to be sold within the state of Iowa shall be permitted from June 28 to July 4 of each year. The permitted hours shall start at 12:00 p.m. and end at 11:00 p.m., then again from December 31 starting at 12:00 p.m. to 12:30 a.m. on January 1 of the following year.

Restriction as to age. Consumer fireworks that are identified as being class one or class two may only be

discharged by individuals that are 18 years of age and older. Fireworks that are classified as novelties (APAS 87-1) may be discharged by individuals 5 years of age and older but only when supervised by an adult.

Restrictions as to locations. An individual shall not use consumer fireworks on real property other than that individual’s real property or on real property of a person who has consented to the use of consumer fireworks on that property.

No fireworks shall be permitted to be discharged in areas zoned C-3/ Commercial District or C-4/ Commercial District at any time.

No individual shall discharge any consumer fireworks within 75 feet of another person or within 75 feet of a structure.

Restrictions due to drought conditions. No person shall discharge consumer fireworks at any time when Pottawattamie County has issued a burn ban.

Penalty: Any discharging of the above referenced consumer fireworks outside of the excepted dates, hours or locations or under conditions restricted above shall be deemed a simple misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not less than **\$250.00.**

ROWING REGATTA - SATURDAY, JULY 14

An exciting event is planned to take place on Carter Lake during the 34th annual Cornhusker State Games - Iowa Games.

Featuring 68 competitive sports events at venues in Carter Lake, Lincoln, Omaha and surrounding communities. Most sporting events take place July 20-29, and officials expect more than 11,000 participants. Rowing, which will take place at Carter Lake, joins the Games as a joint venture between the Iowa Games and Cornhusker State Games. “Rowing clubs from the University of Nebraska and the University of Iowa have been wanting to do a state games event in their respective states, and they both use Carter Lake as a rowing facility – it’s good for that,” said Dave Mlnarik, executive director of the Nebraska Sports Council.

“Rather than trying to put on two separate events and potentially not have a good field of competition, we thought why not just try it together?

We have a lot of friends at the Iowa Games and we are excited to do this as a joint venture.”

Opening Ceremonies are set for July 20 at Seacrest Field in Lincoln with parade-of-athletes, skydivers, fireworks, patriotic tribute, mascot showcase and torch-lighting.

Levi Carter Park at 8 a.m. There will be 1,000 and 2,000 meter sprints. There is no limit to the number of events one may enter.

Levels of Competition:

Recreation – Defined by the size of the boat. It is a single boat that is wider and shorter than a competitive shell.

Novice sweep rower – A sweep rower who has been rowing less than 12

months.

Novice sculler – A sculler who’s first competition as a sculler has been within the last 12 months.

Junior – A rower under the age of 19, or graduation in 2018 from high school.

Master – A rower who is age 18 years or older as of December 31, 2017. Masters races will be handicapped by age.


