Here we are six months into 2018 and it is that time of year when the days are getting longer and everyone is enjoying the outdoors. As a good neighbor, let us all do our part to keep our properties and community looking good. If you have any concerns, please contact the Police Chief or the Building Inspector. They are handling the abatement process.

Our annual Youth Fishing Derby will be held on June 2<sup>nd</sup> from 9:00 am to Noon at Mabrey Park. It is a great opportunity for the families within the community to get together, so please come and join us! All equipment will be supplied and it is a free event for kids ages 5 to 16.

The following weekend, on June 9<sup>th</sup>, will be our annual Carter Lake Community Day. This is another great opportunity for the families of Carter Lake to get out into their community and meet their neighbors. This year, the festival at Mabrey Park will be free. There will be plenty of activities for kids and the whole family. Some of these include inflatables and pony rides for the kids, face painting and much more! For the fireworks at the baseball field, we are bringing in a 70's cover band to perform from 8:00 pm to midnight. Yet again, this is another free event! This year we have added a few new things throughout the day. Please let us know what you think, so that we can continue to make this an even better event in the coming years.

One of the hot topics in and around town recently has been the Ponca casino and how its presence will benefit our town. Research has been done on the 2000 and 2009 agreements in place between the City

of Carter Lake and the Ponca Tribe. In the 2009 agreement, it was found that there was a "Pilot Agreement" that was not carried out or collected by the City's previous administrations. I proceeded to meet with the Ponca's Chairman, negotiated and received a \$101,200 payment for the Ponca Smoke Signals. Currently, I am looking more into the call volume and impact of the casinos across the river in Council Bluffs. Through this, we are trying to figure out public safety and city improvement costs. The Ponca Tribe has been very open during this discussion and we are both happy to announce that they will be moving forward with the casino project. The Ponca Tribe plans on opening the casino this coming fall.

Last week, a meeting was held between The Advance Southwest Iowa Cooperation, The Iowa Department of Natural Resources, a state representative and myself. At this meeting, we discussed a proposed development that I have been working on for the past few months. It was a very well received idea and the meeting went very well. I hope to announce this new development very soon. It will bring new life to the entrance of our town located on Locust and Abbott Drive.

The last six months as your Mayor have been an honor, and I look forward to the progress and development of our town over these next few years. Thank you for the opportunity to serve the community of Carter Lake.

# Announcements and Reminders

## STORMWATER TIPS

Preventing Water Pollution is everyone's responsibility.

### GUIDE TO LAWN MAINTENANCE

#### Fertilizers

Use fertilizers sparingly.

Cleanup any excess that spills onto driveway or sidewalk.

#### No "P" Fertilizers

There are 3 numbers on a fertilizer bag for N, P, K. Use the no "P" or very low "P" as there is already plenty of phosphorous in our soils.

#### Pet Waste

Pick up all [pet waste](#) in your yard and when you take your pet for a walk.

#### Mow High

If you want less watering, wait to mow your grass when it is 4-5 inches high. Roots will grow longer, which then requires less watering.

#### Restore Healthy Soil

Reduce compaction and increase organic matter content. Aerate

your lawn, then apply a thin layer of compost (1/4-1/2") and additional seed if desired.

Storm water pollutants and sources include:

- ◆ Sediment from construction sites, streambank erosion, disturbed areas
- ◆ Pesticides and fertilizers from lawns, parks and roadsides • Bacteria from pet wastes and septic systems
- ◆ Nutrients from lawn fertilizer • Oil and grease from car leaks, gas stations and industrial areas Road salt and sand from snow and ice control applications
- ◆ Carelessly discarded trash such as cigarette butts, paper wrappers and plastic bottles
- ◆ Illicit connections to storm sewers
- ◆ Illegally dumped pollutants
- ◆ Thermal impacts from sun-heated impervious surfaces transferring heat to rainfall runoff

## *Boating Regulations and Suggestions*

### **CARTER LAKE**

#### **NO WAKE REGULATIONS**

571-40.46(462A) Zoning of Carter Lake, Pottawattamie County. 40.46(1) All vessels operated in a designated zone known as Shoal Pointe Canal shall be operated at a speed not greater than 5 miles per hour.

40.46(2) The City of Carter Lake shall designate and maintain the 5-mile-per-hour speed zone with marker buoys approved by the Natural Resource Commission.

Iowa Department of Natural Resources conservation officers have the authority to enforce Iowa's boating laws. The U.S. Coast Guard also has enforcement authority on federally controlled waters.

Officers have the authority to stop and inspect a vessel being launched, being operated, or being moored on Iowa waters to determine whether the vessel is properly registered, numbered, and equipped.

Officers may board a vessel in the course of an inspection if the operator is unable to supply visual evidence that the vessel is properly registered and equipped.

It is illegal to fail to bring your vessel to a stop, or to attempt to elude an officer, after being given a visual and audible signal to stop. An officer may signal you to stop by displaying a blue light or flashing blue and red lights, or by sounding horn.

#### **SUGGESTIONS FOR SAFE BOATING**

1. Alcohol and boating don't mix. Wind, sun, glare and heat can enhance the effects of alcohol, hindering the operator's ability to

make decisions.

2. Before leaving the house, check trailer lights, wheel bearings and hitch.

3. Make sure there is a charged fire extinguisher and horn/whistle, a wearable life jacket for everyone and a U.S. Coast Guard-approved throw-able device onboard.

4. File a float plan with a friend: include your destination, time of return and type of boat.

5. Wear your lifejacket—it floats, you don't. Inflatable lifejackets are light weight, comfortable and USCG approved. Wear it.

6. Take a boater education course. It has valuable information and many insurance companies offer a discount on boat insurance.

7. Iowa's top two safety violations are having inadequate life jackets and operating too fast and too close to other vessels.

#### **WHO MAY OPERATE A VESSEL**

1. A person under 12 years of age may operate a vessel propelled by a motor of more than 10 horsepower, including a personal watercraft, only if he or she is accompanied on board by a responsible person who is at least 18 years old and experienced in operating the vessel.

2. A person 12 years of age or older but younger than 18 years of age may operate a vessel propelled by a motor of more than 10 horsepower, including a personal watercraft, only if he or she: has successfully completed a boater education course approved by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources

3. Or ... is accompanied on board by a responsible person who is at least 18 years old and experienced in operating the vessel.

4. Persons required to have successfully completed a boater education course must carry their boater education certificate on board and make it available upon request by an enforcement officer.

#### **COURTESY WHEN ENCOUNTERING OTHER VESSELS**

1. Jumping the wake of a passing boat, or riding too close to another PWC, a boat, or a canoe/kayak, creates risks and is restricted or even prohibited in some states. The vessel making the wake may block the PWC operator's view of oncoming traffic and also conceal the PWC operator from approaching vessels.

2. Excessive noise from PWC's often makes them unwelcome with other vessel operators and people on shore. Be a courteous PWC operator.

3. Vary your operating area, and do not keep repeating the same maneuver.

4. Avoid congregating with other PWC operators near shore, which increases annoying noise levels.

5. Avoid maneuvers that cause the engine exhaust to lift out of the water because that increases noise levels.

6. Do not modify your engine exhaust system if it increases the noise.

7. Improperly modified exhausts will not make your PWC faster and may raise the noise to an illegal level.

## *Saving the Planet with Recycling*

Red River is the exclusive residential service provider for the City of Carter Lake.

**Trash/Yard Waste:** The center of 13th Street is the dividing line, meaning half of the street is picked up on each day. All residents west of 13th St. are picked up on Wednesdays. All residents east of 13th St. trash and yard waste is collected on Thursdays.

**Recycling** All residents will have their recycling picked up on Mondays of each week. We have found out that some residents like using 96 gallon carts. Contact Red River to rent one of these carts.

In addition, Red River also offers small commercial dumpsters for businesses and large roll off dumpsters for businesses or home needs for a fee.

**Helpful Tips** to ensure your trash or recycling is picked up every week

- Place trash or recycling on the curb in front of your house no later than 5 a.m. the day your trash or recycling is scheduled for pickup
- Trash can must be on the curb. Employees will not go into your yard or to your garage to fetch cans
- Please take part in recycling. Stop by City Hall to pick up a FREE blue recycling tub.
- Refer to the recycle list below.
- **DO NOT** place recyclables inside plastic bags. Anything inside a plastic bag will NOT be picked up and will be left in the bin.

- **Hazardous materials** (flammables, propane tanks, auto parts, explosives). Auto parts should be taken to an auto salvage yard. Propane Tanks and Hazardous Materials may be dropped off to the Recycling Center, 4441 Gifford Road, Council Bluffs (712) 328-4985
- **E-Waste (electronics).** The Recycling Center, 4441 Gifford Road, Council Bluffs, (712)328-4985. Drop off VCR's, DVD players, stereo equipment, clock radios, gaming equipment, computer towers and keyboards, input devices, scanners, video and surveillance cameras, fax machines and cordless phones for recycling (Cost 25 cents/lb).

- ♻ White & colored paper of all thickness
- ♻ Shredded paper **IF** in closed paper sacks or boxes & marked as such

##### BOXES

- ♻ Cardboard boxes
- ♻ Brown paper sacks
- ♻ Cereal boxes without inside plastic bag
- ♻ Juice and milk cartons, egg cartons
- ♻ Pasta, food, and soda boxes & empty pizza boxes

##### PLASTIC

- ♻ Laundry detergent bottles
- ♻ Cleaning solution bottles
- ♻ Plastic hangers
- ♻ Plastic soda & water bottles with lids
- ♻ Plastic clam shell containers – empty & rinsed
- ♻ Plastic bottles and tubs – empty & rinsed
- ♻ Milk jugs and other beverage containers – empty & rinsed

##### METAL

- ♻ Aluminum, tin, and steel cans/lids – empty & rinsed
- ♻ Soda cans
- ♻ Aluminum bottles
- ♻ Empty aerosol cans

## WEEDS & MOWING

It is that time of year again when the grass and weeds take over our lawns. It is the responsibility of all property owners to keep their land and the adjacent parking areas free of weeds and grass that are 9” or taller. The City will have any uncontrolled weed growth abated without prior notice to the property owner. The cost of the abatement will be billed to the property owner along with a \$75 administrative fee. Do not mow, blow or sweep your grass clipping onto the street or the curb area!

## BULK PICKUP

If you have couches, chairs, or appliances that need to go to the landfill. Please call Red River Waste Solutions and pay a fee. After the fee is paid, the items will be picked up on your next garbage collection day. These items should not be left on the curb until pickup has been scheduled. (712) 527-5910

Building permits are available online and at City Hall. Here is a sample of permits that are required in Carter Lake: siding, windows & door

replacement, roofing, interior and exterior structural renovations, garage, shed, fences, replacement of water heater, furnace or air conditioner, plumbing and electrical upgrades.






