Garbage and Recycling in Carter Lake

Waste Connections, Inc. is the exclusive residential service provider for the City of Carter Lake.

Trash/Yard Waste: The center of 13th Street is the dividing line, meaning half of the street is picked up on each day. All residents west of 13th St. are picked up on Wednesdays. All residents east of 13th St., trash and yard waste is collected on Thursdays. Waste Connections no longer rents the 96 gallon carts, but you may provide your own.

Recycling All residents will have their recycling picked up on Mondays of each week. .

Waste Connections offers small commercial dumpsters for businesses and large roll off dumpsters for

businesses or home needs for a fee.

Helpful Tips to ensure your trash or recycling is picked up every week

- Place trash or recycling on the curb in front of your house no later than 5 a.m. the day your trash or recycling is scheduled for pickup.
- Trash cans must be on the curb. Employees will not go into the yard or garage to fetch containers.
- Trash must be inside trash receptacles not in bags on ground
- Limit of 5 containers per week
- Refer to the recycle list below.
- **DO NOT** place recyclables inside plastic bags. Anything inside a plastic bag will NOT be picked up and will be left in the bin.

RECYCLING MATERIALS LIST

CARTS MUST BE AT THE CURB THE NIGHT BEFORE COLLECTION DAY.

Products that are allowed for recycling:

PAPER

- ♻ Magazines, catalogs, literature, brochures
- ♻ Bulk mail
- ♻ Phone & paperback books
- ♻ Newspaper with ads
- ♻ All envelopes including plastic windows
- ♻ White & colored paper of all thickness
- ♻ Shredded paper **IF** in closed paper sacks or boxes & marked as such

BOXES

- ♻ Cardboard boxes
- ♻ Brown paper sacks
- ♻ Cereal boxes without inside plastic bag
- ♻ Juice and milk cartons, egg cartons
- ♻ Pasta, food, and soda boxes & empty pizza boxes

PLASTIC

- ♻ Laundry detergent bottles
- ♻ Cleaning solution bottles
- ♻ Plastic hangers
- ♻ Plastic soda & water bottles with lids
- ♻ Plastic clam shell containers – empty & rinsed
- ♻ Plastic bottles and tubs – empty & rinsed
- ♻ Milk jugs and other beverage containers – empty & rinsed

METAL

- ♻ Aluminum, tin, and steel cans/lids – empty & rinsed
- ♻ Soda cans
- ♻ Aluminum bottles
- ♻ Empty aerosol cans

Products that are NOT allowed in any quantity:

- ⊗ Glass bottles or jars
- ⊗ Window or door glass
- ⊗ Light bulbs or light tubes
- ⊗ Plastic bags
- ⊗ Shrink wrap
- ⊗ Hard plastic pipe
- ⊗ Oversized items such as toys, car bumpers, swing sets
- ⊗ Plastic or steel strapping
- ⊗ Products containing bodily fluids such as diapers, personal hygiene products, etc.
- ⊗ Motor oil bottles, lawn chemical bottles, or other hazardous chemical bottles
- ⊗ Hose including garden hose, rubber tubing, and other plastic tubing
- ⊗ Other commercial or construction waste including reinforced plastic film
- ⊗ Styrofoam
- ⊗ Hard cover books
- ⊗ Multi-wall sacks such as dog food bags
- ⊗ Ceiling tiles
- ⊗ Wire hangers, steel or copper wiring
- ⊗ Electronic devices (i.e. radios, computers, televisions, etc.)
- ⊗ Medical waste
- ⊗ Dead animals

Cornhusker State Games Regatta on Carter Lake

The Cornhusker State Games is a statewide amateur sports festival for all Nebraskans. The purpose of the Games is to provide top-quality amateur competition in a wide range of activities. The 2019 Games are scheduled for July 19-28 at more than 70 sites in Lincoln, Omaha and surrounding communities.

Besides offering a wide range of competitions (from traditional Olympic sports such as Track & Field, Gymnastics and Swimming) Nebraskans' competitive interests are served by less demanding events such as Horseshoe Pitching, Mallwalk and Chess.

The Cornhusker State Games Regatta will be held at Levi Carter Park and Carter Lake July 13th, 2019, from 7:00 am till 4:00 pm. Crews will be docked and launching on the

north side of the lake in the east parking lot and boat launch. The race course will run East to West on the north straight away (airport end toward pavilion for 1,500 meters). Safety boats with US Rowing Referees will be present to ensure the fair and safe participation of the athletes and their shells. The race course is a no wake zone for the safety of participants.

This is a great opportunity to enjoy boat races (Olympic style) and cheer on the athletes that train so hard all year. Thank you for all your support.

IOWA Boating Regulations

CARTER LAKE

NO WAKE REGULATIONS

571-40.46(462A) Zoning of Carter Lake, Pottawattamie County. 40.46(1) All vessels operated in a designated zone known as Shoal Pointe Canal shall be operated at a speed not greater than 5 miles per hour.

40.46(2) The City of Carter Lake shall designate and maintain the 5-mile-per-hour speed zone with marker buoys approved by the Natural Resource Commission.

Iowa Department of Natural Resources conservation officers have the authority to enforce Iowa's boating laws.

Officers have the authority to stop and inspect a vessel being launched, being operated, or being moored on Iowa waters to determine whether the vessel is properly registered, numbered, and equipped. Officers may board a vessel in the course of an inspection if the operator is unable to supply visual evidence that the vessel is properly registered and equipped.

It is illegal to fail to bring your vessel to a stop, or to attempt to elude an officer, after being given a visual and audible signal to stop. An officer may signal you to stop by displaying a blue light or flashing blue and red lights, or by sounding horn.

BOATING SAFETY SUGGESTIONS

1. Alcohol and boating don't mix. Wind, sun, glare and heat can enhance the effects of alcohol, hindering the operator's ability to make decisions.
2. Before leaving the house, check trailer lights, wheel bearings and hitch.
3. Make sure there is a charged fire extinguisher and horn/whistle, a wearable life jacket for everyone and a U.S. Coast Guard-approved throw-able device onboard.
4. File a float plan with a friend: include your destination, time of return and type of boat.
5. Wear your lifejacket—it floats, you don't. Inflatable lifejackets are light weight, comfortable and USCG approved. Wear it.
6. Take a boater education course. It has valuable information and many insurance companies offer a discount on boat insurance.
7. Iowa's top two safety violations are having inadequate life jackets and operating too fast and too

close to other vessels.

WHO MAY OPERATE A VESSEL

1. A person under 12 years of age may operate a vessel propelled by a motor of more than 10 horsepower, including a personal watercraft, only if he or she is accompanied on board by a responsible person who is at least 18 years old and experienced in operating the vessel.
2. A person 12 years of age or older but younger than 18 years of age may operate a vessel propelled by a motor of more than 10 horsepower, including a personal watercraft, only if he or she: has successfully completed a boater education course approved by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources
3. Or ... is accompanied on board by a responsible person who is at least 18 years old and experienced in operating the vessel.
4. Persons required to have successfully completed a boater education course must carry their boater education certificate on board and make it available upon request by an enforcement officer.

COURTESY WHEN ENCOUNTERING OTHER VESSELS

1. Jumping the wake of a passing boat, or riding too close to another PWC, a boat, or a canoe/kayak, creates risks and is restricted or even prohibited in some states. The vessel making the wake may block the PWC operator's view of oncoming traffic and also conceal the PWC operator from approaching vessels.
2. Excessive noise from PWC's often makes them unwelcome with other vessel operators and people on shore. Be a courteous PWC operator.
3. Vary your operating area, and do not keep repeating the same maneuver.
4. Avoid congregating with other PWC operators near shore, which increases annoying noise levels.
5. Avoid maneuvers that cause the engine exhaust to lift out of the water because that increases noise levels.
6. Do not modify your engine exhaust system if it increases the noise.
7. Improperly modified exhausts will not make your PWC faster and may raise the noise to an illegal level.







Carter Lake Fireworks Safety

July 1 - July 6

Consumer fireworks may be discharged on the above days during the hours of 12 noon - 10 p.m., except for Saturdays and July 4 from 9 a.m. - 11 p.m., and

January 1

from 12:00 a.m. - 12:30 a.m.

Penalty:

Any discharging of consumer fireworks outside of the excepted dates, hours, or locations or under conditions restricted shall be deemed a simple misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$250.

Restrictions:

- Class 1 and Class 2 may not be discharged by anyone under the age of 18.
- Novelties may be discharged by anyone 5 or older, but only when supervised by an adult.
- Individuals may only light fireworks on their own property or property where they have the consent of the owner.
- No fireworks are permitted to be charged on areas zoned C-3/ Commercial or C4/Commercial.
- No individual shall discharge fireworks within 30 feet of another person or within 30 feet of a structure.
- No person shall discharge consumer fireworks at any time when Pottawattamie County has issued a burn ban.
- Fireworks are not permitted on public property which includes the right-of-way (ie. street, sidewalks,
