Letter from Mayor Cumberledge

Hello all,

Over the past few months, the City Council and I have been working on a few ordinance changes, updates, and some project planning. Our energy provider – OPPD, will be out changing street lights throughout our town and replacing with new style LED lights. This should save our energy cost by about 20% upon completion. They are expecting to start this project soon.

The City has a walking trail system planned as well. This trail is planned to run down the west side of 9th Street from Locust Street to Q Street to tie in with the club area. Our goal this spring, is to start on the areas without sidewalks first. Property owners along that route with any questions, please call. No driveway access will be changed along this route and all work on the walking trail will be done by our City employees.

I would also like to take a moment to acknowledge Officers Swinarski, Chambers, and Edmonds. On April 18th, at approximately 9:30 pm, the three officers named were on patrol and noticed a fire on a resident’s deck. The

officers acted quickly and removed the two occupants who were asleep in their home. The officers then knocked down the bulk of the fire with a garden hose and the Police cruiser fire extinguisher, until the Fire Department arrived, about five minutes later. Thanks to those Officers, the residents were not harmed and the house had minimal damage.


In March, our Police Department made 17 arrests with 36 charges. They wrote 40 reports and also issued 167 traffic citations.

STORMWATER TIPS

Preventing Water Pollution is everyone's responsibility.

GUIDE TO LANDSCAPING

Plant Trees

Plant trees in your yard. The canopies intercept rain and evaporate water back into the atmosphere.

Native Plants

Use deep rooted native grasses and flowers in your gardens. Minimize the amount of turf in your yard, especially if you have a lot of open area, by using native plants.

Native Turf

Plant your yard with deep rooted native turf grasses. Try using Buffalo and Side Oats Gramma grasses, then mow as a standard lawn, with no need to water or fertilize.

Rain Gardens

Create a rain garden to capture downspout water or runoff from your lawn. Dig a depression in a well drained area where soils will soak up water and not let it puddle. Amend soil before planting, if needed.

Animal Control

The weather is getting warmer and our pets are going to be spending more time outside. Here are a few things you need to know to keep them safe

1. Anytime you have animal outside unattended you need to provide a few things for them. Clean water and an approved shelter must be provided at all times. This is a requirement of the city ordinances regardless of how long the animal is outside.
2. Your animal can only be outside for 30 minutes if it is on a leash or chain. The only exception to this is if an adult over the age of 19 is outside with the animal or

you have a fully fenced yard. Additionally, if you do have an animal on a tie out you must make certain that it cannot reach public sidewalk or your neighbors yard.

3. Remember to pick up your pet waste. Not only is this a health hazard to your animal but can also be a nuisance to your neighbors. The warmer weather will cause excess pet waste to smell very badly. The first offense could result in a \$500.00 fine.
4. Barking dogs are a common complaint. It is your responsibility as a dog owner to control your dogs action especially barking. Barking dogs can be heard for

blocks and usually set off a chain reaction of other dogs barking.

5. It is unlawful to leave an animal unattended in a vehicle. Temperatures inside vehicles can easily reach over 100 degrees. This can cause serious health problems and even result in death. Even with the windows cracked and a bowl of water the temperatures can still be to much for your animal to handle.



Problem:

Pain is multi-dimensional and may be best treated with a holistic, biopsychosocial approach that addresses functional outcomes as well as pain

2 million Americans abused or were dependent on prescription opioids in 2014

180,000 deaths from overdoses from 1999-2015



Research Question

What is the state of the science regarding the impact of massage therapy on function for those experiencing pain?

Findings:

Evidence strongly supports massage therapy compared to no treatment for pain management

Massage therapy compares well with other interventions to manage pain

Massage therapy may be beneficial for improving several functional outcomes, including anxiety and health-related quality of life



Application:

The opioid crisis has made finding non-pharmacological approaches to pain management a high priority

Massage therapy is a low-risk, potentially effective intervention for people living with pain




