



To the Citizens of Carter Lake:

The months just seem to fly by; I have been highlighting different departments over the last couple months. There are 8 departments all together. Previously, I have highlighted the Parks and Maintenance Departments.

This month is the Edward Owen Library. Theresa Hawkins is the library director. The library is set up different than other departments. The City built, owns and maintains the building along with providing funds for the budget. The library has a board of directors, these volunteers are appointed by the Mayor; the board selects a chairperson, and they work under the rules of the State Library Association. It sounds complicated, but it works.

It would behoove all of the citizens, who are not familiar with the library, to check it out. To me the library stands tall and in any community when it comes to importance. It is a place in a community where a person can go to study and or research because they want to or need to of their own free will.

The Edward Owen Library is a true asset to the City of Carter Lake. It goes back to when volunteers used to house the library in empty building's any place they could find one. Until the late Edward

Owens (Chairman of PVS) stepped up with a challenge to build a library where it stands today; Mr. Owens would put up half of the estimated cost to have an architect draw up the plans, construct and furnish the building for \$80,000. The City Council agreed and set to the task of raising \$40,000 dollars. The City had some money on hand, started the fundraising with \$15,000 and approved \$10,000 in bonds; donations filled in the rest. A big thanks to all those who have been involved with keeping this very needed and appreciated facility alive in Carter Lake today.

Finally, those of you that use 9th street on a daily basis, thank you for your patience over the last 6 weeks while the contractor finished a major upgrade to the sanitary sewer system with a new lift station that will service homes and businesses west of 9th Street from P Street to K Street. Your patience was and is greatly appreciated.

Finally, if you have a problem or question, just call City Hall and Jackie, Lisa or Risa can get you connected to the right person.

As always, it is an honor and privilege to serve as your Mayor.

Announcements and Reminders

GRASS AND WEEDS

City codes require that property owners cut or destroy all noxious weeds and shall keep the land free of growth. Property owners must keep their grass mowed so that it is less than nine inches (9”) tall. If your grass is taller than nine inches, the city will take immediate action and have it mowed, without prior notice. You will be billed for the cost of abatement plus a \$75.00 administrative fee. The City does NOT want to be in the mowing business. Please take care of your property! This also includes weed pulling, weed eating or whatever it takes to clear weeds from around trees, sign posts, along curbs, etc.

SHRED FEST

Identity thieves routinely search through dumpsters and trash cans, looking to find confidential

information. One way to keep your identity safe is to shred documents containing personal information. This includes bank and credit card statements, tax forms, and medical bills.

Carter Lake will host our event at City Hall on Saturday October 28 10-12 p.m. work in a safe and secure manner.

Security experts recommend shredding the following types of materials:



- Old documents: Papers that carry your Social Security number, birth date, signature, account numbers, passwords or PINs.
- Banking: Canceled or unused checks. Shred deposit slips and ATM and credit card receipts, once you receive your monthly

statements.

- Credit Cards: Preapproved credit card applications and incentive/gift checks from credit card companies.
- Medical: Unneeded bills.
- Investments: Investment Account statements.
- Obsolete ID cards: Expired driver’s licenses, medical insurance cards, and passports.

Gill's Guide to Healthy Surface Water Empty Your Pool and Spa with Care



This is it - the end of the summer and time to empty the pool until next year. Chlorine and other chemicals used to keep your pool or spa clean causes BIG problems for us fish and other aquatic life. ALL it takes is a FEW steps to not compromise or pollute the "air" (i.e. water) we breath:

- Allow pool / spa to sit at least seven days without adding chlorine or other chemicals - chlorine content should be 0.1 milligrams per liter.
- Ensure the pH of the pool / spa water is between 7 and 8.
- Drain water through at least 15 feet of a grassy landscape first (i.e. not directly onto concrete) to allow remaining chemicals to disappate before reaching the storm drain.
- Keep the flow of water low (shoot for 700 gallons per hour = 12 gallons per minute or so) - to prevent erosion and having to fix the landscaped area later.

Thomas Gilman Captures Wrestling World Championship Silver Medal

Thomas Gilman entered his first world championships ranked No. 19, but made his case to the world that he should be higher after capturing the silver medal on Friday at the 2017 UWW World Wrestling Championships in Paris.

It was a banner day for Americans as the U.S. men won three medals on the first day of men's freestyle action. J'den Cox followed up his bronze medal from the Olympic Games Rio 2016 with a world championship bronze medal at 86 kg. Nick Gwiazdowski earned his first senior world medal by securing bronze at 125 kg.

The 23-year-old Gilman gave a spirited effort but came up short in the gold medal match, losing 6-0 to Japan's Yuki Takahashi in the 57 kg. weight class.

Gilman, a three-time All-American at the University of Iowa, took an early shot but Takahashi drove him out of bounds for a caution and two-point score. Takahashi, ranked No. 8 in the world coming in, added a takedown for a 4-0 lead at the break, and scored another takedown late in the match to cement the win.

Gilman earned the only championship bout performance for U.S. wrestlers after a thrilling 5-4 semifinal win over North Korea's Hak-Jin Jong. The former Hawkeye picked up a 12-1 win over Uzbekistan's Nodirjon Safarov in the quarterfinals. His other wins on the day included a 5-2 win over Andrey Yatsenko of Ukraine and a gutsy 3-0 decision over Iran's Reza Atrinagharchi.

Cox, a three-time NCAA champion from the University of Missouri, shut out 2010 world champion Mihail Ganev of Bulgaria 8-0 to win the bronze medal at 86 kg. Cox took a 1-0 lead over Ganev at the break off the shot clock. He scored a takedown on a low single leg attack to go up 3-0 after taking a poke in the eye, then hit two more takedowns to clinch the bronze medal.

Gwiazdowski, a two-time NCAA champion at North Carolina State, took a 1-0 lead after Zolboo Natsagsuren of Mongolia went on the shot clock for passivity, then scored a takedown just before the break for a 3-0 lead. He gave up a point from the shot clock before recording one more takedown for the 5-1 win and bronze medal.

Gwiazdowski fell into the bronze medal match after losing by technical fall to multiple world champion Taha Akgul of Turkey in the semifinals.




